

CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES AT CFI

Another construction milestone has occurred at CFI with the newest work on the Mill Building. "Structural and cladding work for the mill building is complete, with only doors and trim remaining," said Frank Pitman, Infrastructure and Construction Manager for CFI. "In late November, equipment installation began," continued Frank.

The site has also seen a large concrete pour for the beginning of Dense Media Separation plant construction. Thirty-five truckloads of cement were required for the plant base.
